CALL TO ORDER / PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

ROLL CALL

The Clerk took the roll call and all were present.

COMMUNICATIONS

There were no communications.

OPEN FORUM

Web Sisson expressed concern about building security. He stated that a security guard should be at the door at all times to protect the staff and that every employee should have a badge.

Jay Abbey agreed that more security is needed in the building. Regarding the Hancock report, he stated that there was a serious breach when the person who exposed the confidential witnesses was never identified. He said it needs to be investigated further.

Two representatives from the Tobacco Free Broome and Tioga Program spoke. They are

concerned about reported illegal sales by the tobacco retailer on River Road. The Board was informed that there are strategies for illegal tobacco sales that can be controlled by zoning and licensing laws. Their program has services and resources that the Town can use to help protect the young people in the community.

A resident said a hard copy of the minutes should go out to interested residents who do not have access to computers.

A resident asked for the Board to supply the cost of the Hancock Report as promised.

GPS in Town Vehicles Discussion

Councilperson DiMascio thanked Superintendent Kraak for his help in identifying the

vehicles that will be using GPS. Information was provided for Highway Trac Technology, a company that is highly recommended. The Town's procurement policy requires three quotes, and Councilperson DiMascio agreed to get two additional quotes. With the GPS technology, safety and productivity will improve and there is likely to be a reduction in insurance cost. A cost analysis will have to be done to see if there is money in the budget and how the cost will be allocated. This will be discussed again at the March 6 meeting. When confusion arose over the correct date for the next meeting, Supervisor Lumsden was forced to admit that his wife was indeed correct when he thought she had made an error in his schedule.

There was discussion about the best way to dispose of Merrill Road. It was agreed that an auction to the highest bidder is a common and effective approach. Assessor Endress spoke with Manasses Auctions and they are willing to auction the property.

PUBLIC HEARINGS - 6:00PM

Public Hearing for an Increase in Water & Sewer Rates

Supervisor Lumsden opened the Public Hearing at 6:00 p.m.

Water rates are proposed to increase by 5% and sewer by 25%. Capital improvements for water would increase from \$3 to \$5, and the capital improvement for sewer would increase from \$3 to \$9.

Mr. Sisson disagrees with the way sewer is charged. He stated that all people should be treated the same, but people with their own wells are not using meters and are being charged a flat rate. He said that every house should have a meter and charged by amount of water used.

Another resident disagreed and said he does not have a meter and pays more than people in his neighborhood who are on both water and sewer.

Superintendent Burden explained that there are 447 flat rate sewer customers that are on well water, and they are charged double what a standard water and sewer customer would pay.

There being no further comment, the Public Hearing was closed at 6:05 p.m.

Ordinance Report

Code Enforcement Official Stiles gave his report for the month of February. The Williamson software for code enforcement will go live on April 2. The implementation is going well. The fire door in his office is down and will remain that way until it can be replaced. He still has not been able to find someone to do fire inspections. He needs to hire an assistant for code enforcement. Two people have taken the test, but results are not in. If an applicant is capable, he or she could be hired provisionally. After hearing complaints of residents of Ransom Road at the last Board meeting who were unhappy with the solar farm being built on their road, Mr. Stiles and Town Engineer Urda visited

the site and issued a stop work order. A DEC agent also visited the project and identified a multitude of violations. Currently they are allowed to work toward compliance but the project is halted until those violations have been corrected and approved.

Section 01 58 00a Specification for New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation Financing Signage

PART 1 GENERAL

1.1 SUMMARY

- A. This specification covers the fabrication and installation of a construction sign for facilities receiving funding for any number of projects through the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation (EFC) Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF) Program, New York State Water Infrastructure Improvement (WIIA), Intermunicipal Grants (IMG), Green Innovative Grant Program (GIGP), Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) Program or Overflow and Stormwater Grants (OSG). Facilities receiving CWSRF or DWSRF funds made available through the federal Bipartisan Infrastructure Law (BIL) are required to utilize the BIL specific template (Specification 01 58 00b).

1.2 RELATED SECTIONS

- A. None

1.3 SUBMITTALS

- A. Shop Drawings: In compliance with direction from the Owner, Contractor shall prepare and submit site plan and mock-up of temporary project signs.

PART 2 PRODUCTS

2.1 GENERAL

- A. The sign shall be fabricated and erected within 21 days following the notice to proceed on the first contract at the facility and shall be maintained by site Contractors, as directed by Owner, until final construction completion for all funded projects at the facility.
- B. For facilities with funding from multiple sources, the logos outlined below must be included on a single project sign including the text "Funded by", as approved by the funding agencies.

- C. There should be one project sign. If the project has multiple locations, one project sign centrally located as directed by the Owner is acceptable.
- D. The attached EFC Project Sign Schematic aligning with funding anticipated for this project shall be used when no other sign exists.

2.2 MATERIALS AND FABRICATION

- A. Sign Panel: The sign panel shall be constructed of 3/4" minimum thickness marine plywood rabbeted into a 2"x4" lumber frame or other such materials capable of withstanding typical weather conditions common to the project area. Use of recycled or recovered materials is encouraged.
- B. Fasteners: All fasteners used in the fabrication of the sign shall be rust-proof.
- C. Sign Supports: The sign shall be adequately supported and braced to remain in the proper positioning and alignment, including resistance to wind loads and toppling of the sign.
- E. Coating: All paint or exterior coverings used shall be exterior grade coating suitable for use on wood or the material of construction. The sign face background and sign back shall be white and consist of a minimum two coats of paint.
- F. Lettering and Emblem: The sign shall include the following logos in an aspect ratio consistent with other lettering on the sign but not less than a height of 2.0".

 2. For DWSRF, DW WIIA, or DW IMG projects: The New York State Department of Health (DOH) logo available at <https://efc.ny.gov/efc-doh-logo>
 3. For CWSRF, OSG, and DWSRF projects: The EPA logo available at <https://efc.ny.gov/epa-logo>, consistent with the EPA Logo & Seal Specifications for Signage Produced by EPA Assistance Agreement Recipients as outlined in https://www.epa.gov/sites/default/files/2015-01/documents/epa_logo_seal_specifications_for_infrastructure_grants.pdf
 4. CWSRF/DWSRF projects incorporate the following language:

- i. This project is jointly funded by the New York State [Clean Water/Drinking Water] State Revolving Fund and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency. The [CWSRF/DWSRF] is administered by the New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation [with its partner the New York State Department of Health (*for DWSRF projects only*)]

PART 3 EXECUTION

3.1 INSTALLATION

- A. The project sign shall be erected in the location and alignment, as directed by the Engineer or Owner, with the bottom of the sign panel a minimum of five feet above existing grade.

3.2 MAINTENANCE

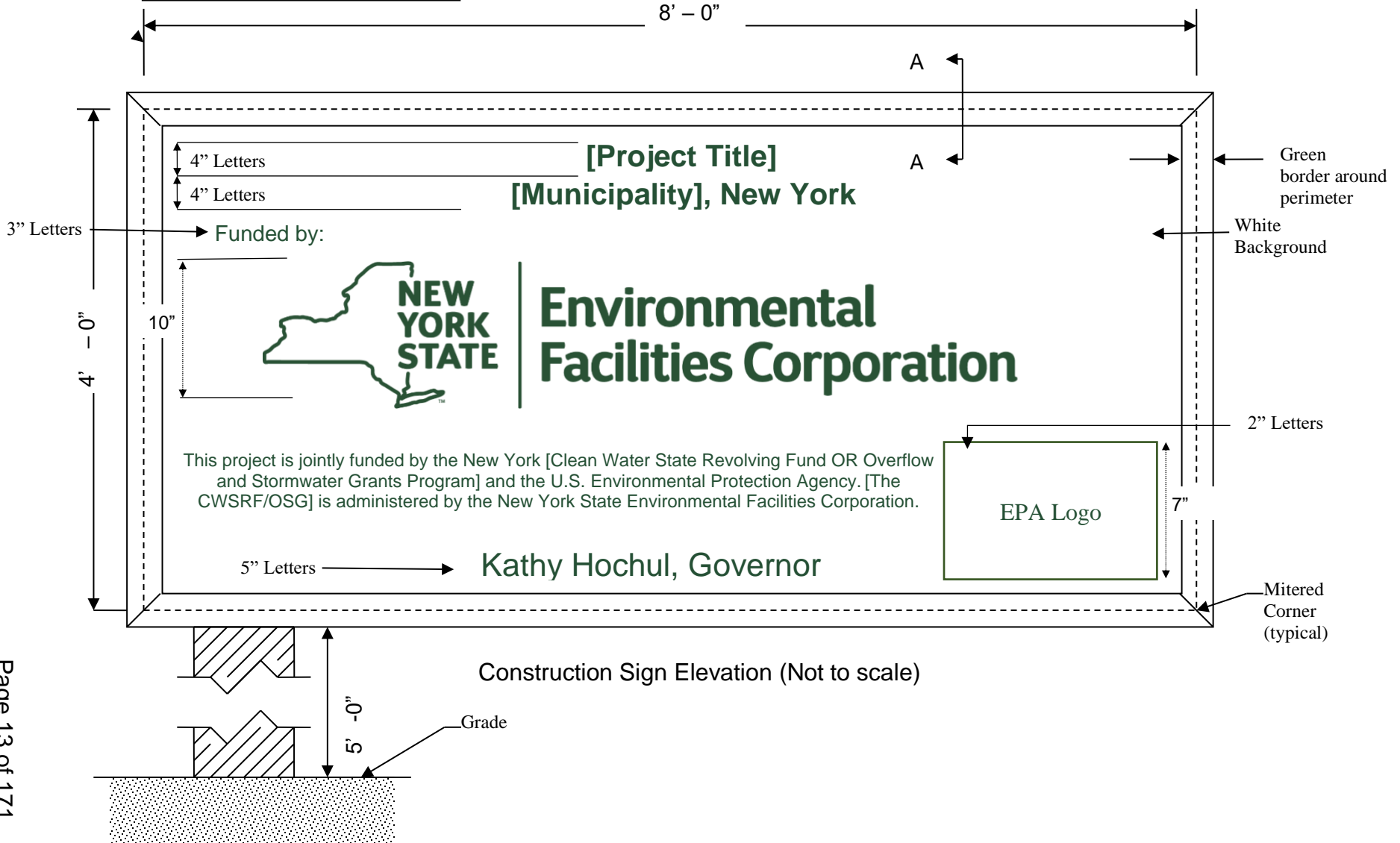
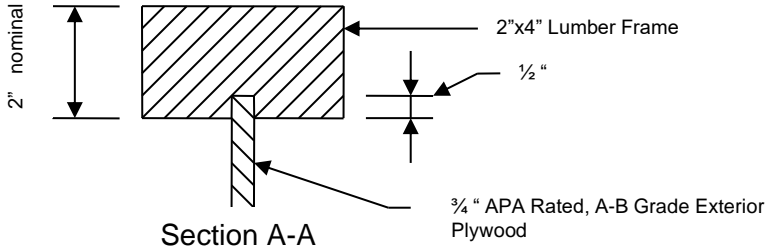
- A. The Contractor shall provide any and all materials required to maintain the sign in good condition throughout the duration of the work.
- B. Upon notification of the Owner, the Contractor shall remove the sign from the construction site.

Example: PLUM0198-005 07/01/2014. PLUM is an abbreviation identifier of the union which prevailed in the survey for this classification, which in this example would be Plumbers. 0198 indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. 07/01/2014 is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate, which in this example is July 1, 2014.

Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all rate changes in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing this classification and rate.

Survey Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the ""SU"" identifier indicate that no one rate prevailed for this classification in the survey and the published rate is derived by computing a weighted average rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that classification. As this weighted average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SULA2012-007 5/13/2014. SU indicates the rates are survey rates based on a weighted average calculation of rates and are not majority rates. LA indicates the State of Louisiana. 2012 is the year of survey on which these classifications and rates are based. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January of each year, to reflect a weighted average of the current negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is

based.

1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:

- * an existing published wage determination
- * a survey underlying a wage determination
- * a Wage and Hour Division letter setting forth a position on a wage determination matter
- * a conformance (additional classification and rate) ruling

The classifications are listed in alphabetical order of ""identifiers"" that indicate whether the particular rate is a union rate (current union negotiated rate for local), a survey rate (weighted average rate) or a union average rate (weighted union average rate).

Union Rate Identifiers

A four letter classification abbreviation identifier enclosed in dotted lines beginning with characters other than ""SU"" or ""UAVG"" denotes that the union classification and rate were prevailing for that classification in the survey. Example: PLUM0198-005 07/01/2014. PLUM is an abbreviation identifier of the union which prevailed in the survey for this classification, which in this example would be Plumbers. 0198 indicates the local union number or district council number where applicable, i.e., Plumbers Local 0198. The next number, 005 in the example, is an internal number used in processing the wage determination. 07/01/2014 is the effective date of the most current negotiated rate, which in this example is July 1, 2014.

Union prevailing wage rates are updated to reflect all rate changes in the collective bargaining agreement (CBA) governing this classification and rate.

Survey Rate Identifiers

Classifications listed under the ""SU"" identifier indicate that no one rate prevailed for this classification in the survey and the published rate is derived by computing a weighted average rate based on all the rates reported in the survey for that classification. As this weighted average rate includes all rates reported in the survey, it may include both union and non-union rates. Example: SULA2012-007 5/13/2014. SU indicates the rates are survey rates based on a weighted average calculation of rates and are not majority rates. LA indicates the State of Louisiana. 2012 is the year of survey on which these classifications and rates are based. The next number, 007 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 5/13/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

Survey wage rates are not updated and remain in effect until a new survey is conducted.

Union Average Rate Identifiers

Classification(s) listed under the UAVG identifier indicate that no single majority rate prevailed for those classifications; however, 100% of the data reported for the classifications was union data. EXAMPLE: UAVG-OH-0010 08/29/2014. UAVG indicates that the rate is a weighted union average rate. OH indicates the state. The next number, 0010 in the example, is an internal number used in producing the wage determination. 08/29/2014 indicates the survey completion date for the classifications and rates under that identifier.

A UAVG rate will be updated once a year, usually in January of each year, to reflect a weighted average of the current negotiated/CBA rate of the union locals from which the rate is

based.

WAGE DETERMINATION APPEALS PROCESS

1.) Has there been an initial decision in the matter? This can be:

- * an existing published wage determination
- * a survey underlying a wage determination

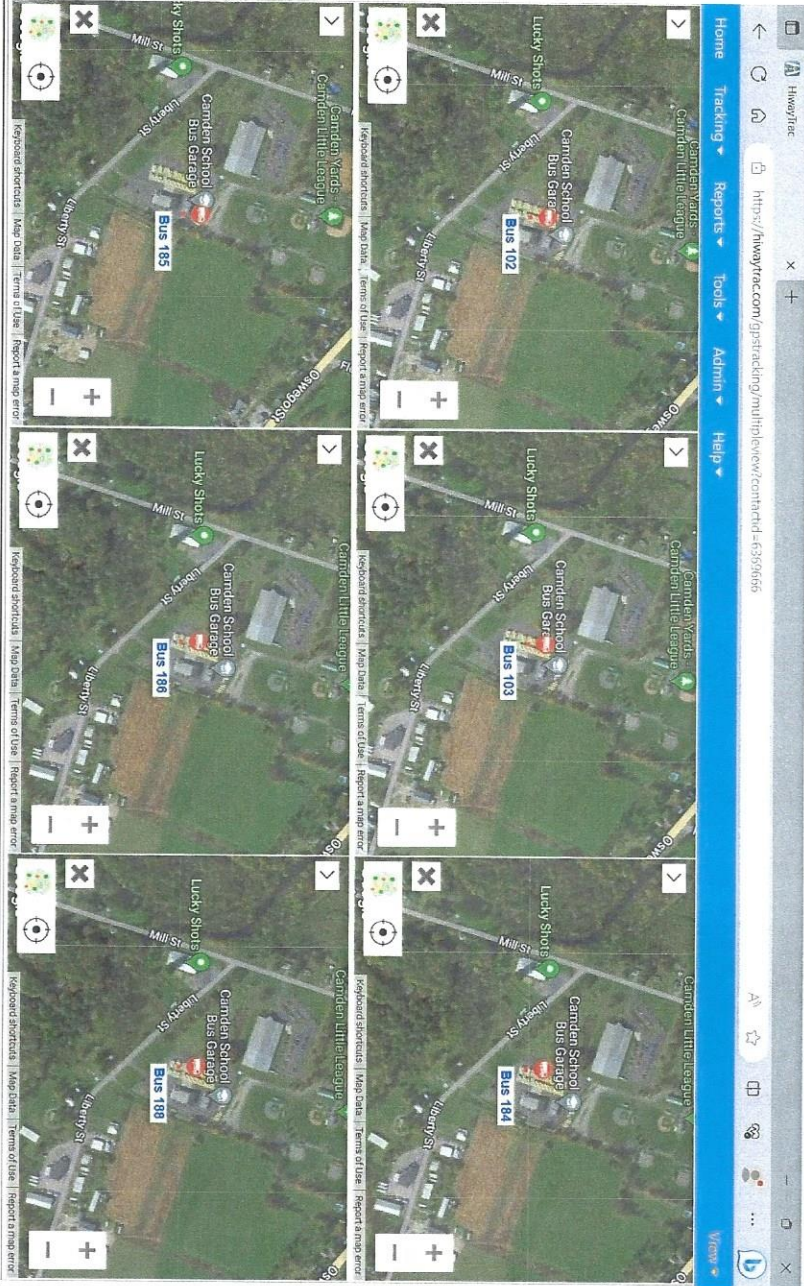

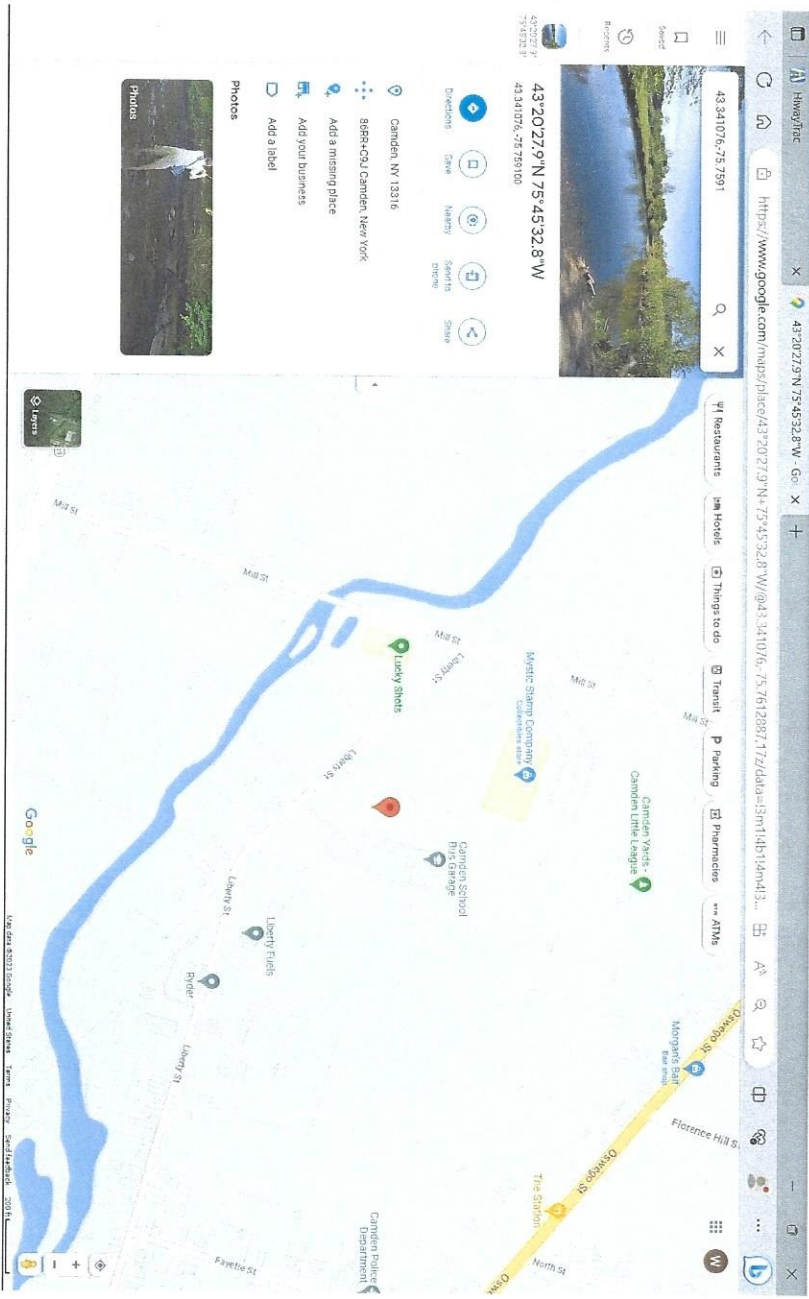

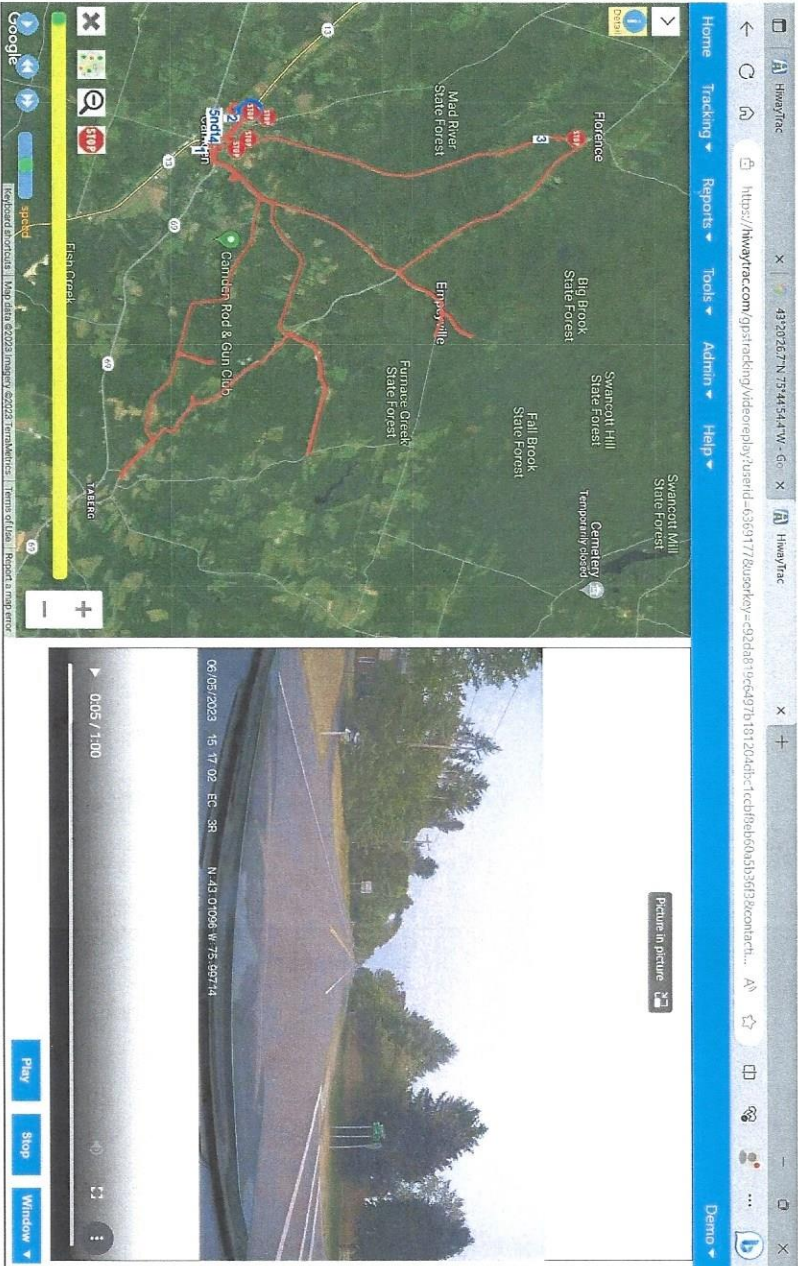

I was asked by a resident of the Town what the posted speed limit is for Prentice Rd. I have spoken with the NYS Department of Transportation regarding this matter and the conclusion is that it is a 55MPH roadway.

There is an increased presence of large commercial vehicles moving in and out of different parcels along this roadway. This roadway is a main connector between the Route 12 corridor and the Chenango Bridge area.

I am very concerned that the combination of large slow-moving trucks combined with the current rate of speed creates an issue that needs to be addressed. I therefore respectfully request that the Town Board exercise its authority to request a speed study be performed.

I am attaching a resolution for this action and the form which the Town Clerk will need to forward to the Broome County Superintendent of Highways who is responsible for forwarding the request to the NYS Department of Transportation.

The Second notice postcard was mailed and has been successful, perhaps too successful, at reaching out to those who didn't know the tax benefits of becoming sixty-five years old. As of Thursday afternoon, we received thirty-four new applications for the Senior Exemption and have received thirty-eight applications for Enhanced STAR. The traffic flow to the Assessor's Office has been consistent. This is in keeping with demographics that the largest portion of U.S. population will turn 65 during 2024 because the largest live birth year was 1959, according to InfoPlease.com. I expect the Town of Chenango to reflect that trend with a larger portion of the population becoming eligible for exemptions targeting those over the age of 65.

Due to the constant stream of exemption applications and the work of training a new Assessor, I have not been able to maintain my expected level of valuations per month – I have fallen behind. The clerical work formerly done by two full-time Ordinance staff members cannot be maintained by one part-time employee. In response, I have posted my office hours on the door and have tried to cover as much as I can with uncompensated overtime. I ask the board members to increase the effort to replace vacant positions.

The opening on the Board of Assessment Review remains. I ask the board members to interview for the position as soon as possible.

Regarding 21 Merrill St., I spoke with Manasse Auctions. They sell real property for Broome County and would be pleased to work with the town in the future. Mapes Auctioneers sell personal property, not real property. Lambrecht Auction, located near Sidney, NY, was not immediately available for comment. A review of their website shows they primarily auction building materials. One real property sale in 2021, Guilford, NY. Mr. Burden and Mr. Kraack have reviewed the list of all properties in the town and have narrowed the "surplus" properties to three. Please below.

Notes regarding Surplus parcels.

Of those which are vacant, Mr. Burden and Mr. Kraack agreed that three are truly surplus. The town has nothing on them and is not intending to use them. The other vacant lots are vacant because they are protected drainage or access to water pumps, or serve some other useful purpose to the town. I thank Mr. Burden and Mr. Kraack for taking the time from their busy schedule to review these properties.

Of the three parcels that both agreed to be surplus, the parcel on Dunham Hill Rd has no public road access. Access is provided only by crossing another parcel. The parcel on Main Street is zoned commercial and according to zoning, is too small to be developed. The town could put both up for auction and perhaps a buyer would find suitable use. The parcel at 21 Merrill would make a good addition to a neighbor's yard. Placed for auction, this parcel would likely meet the floor price.

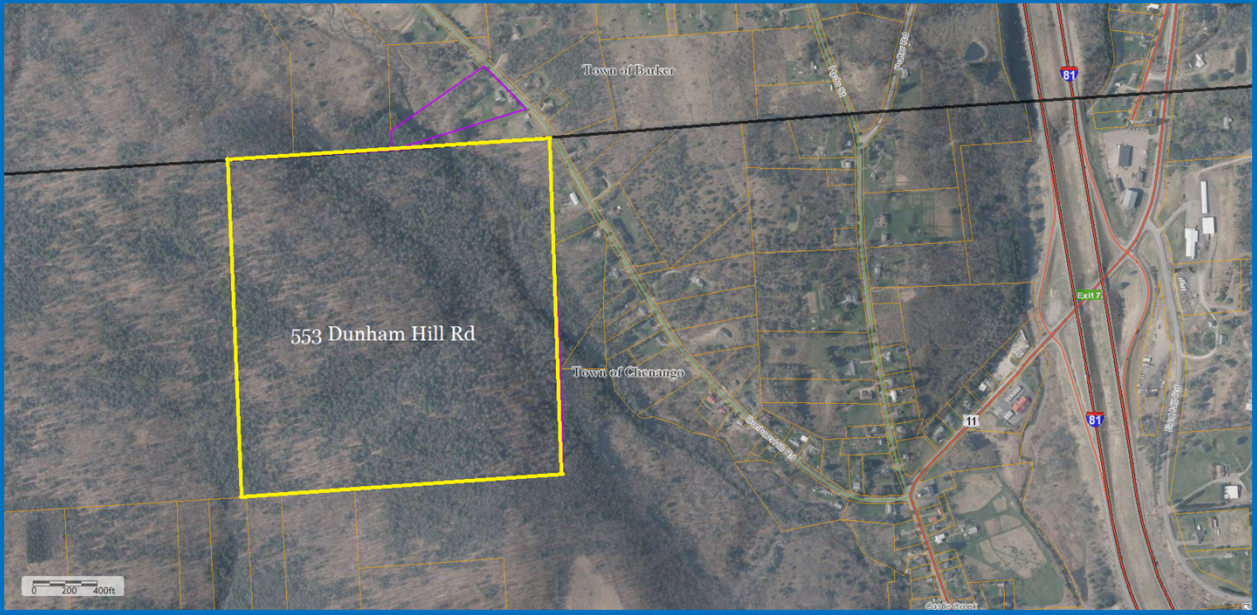

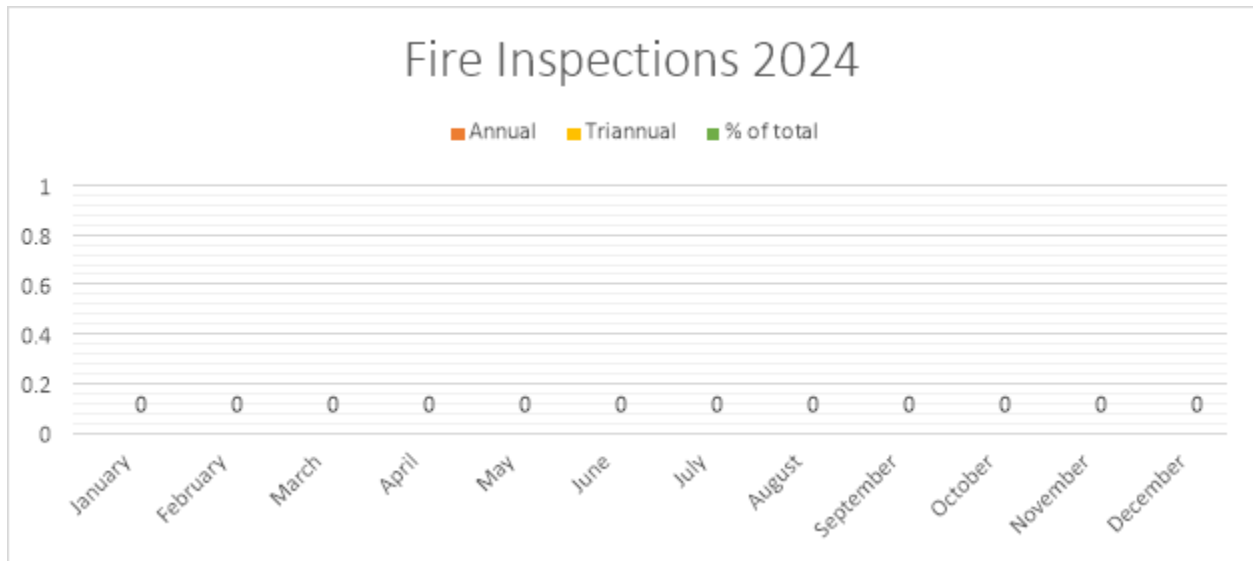
